Please block out in your diaries the evening of Friday 9th November2012 for the AGM & Presentation Night.


Meeting commences at 7 pm sharp.

The start and finish will be from the end of the RYCV Marina (unless shortened course). We will all start together and results places be based on performance handicap from previous races.

The Bluebird State Title Series begins in February 2013. Dates for series will be confirmed and announced at a later date.



Ann Goodwin's Article for the RYCV Mag



Ann is the Treasurer of the BYAV and a passionate Bluebird owner. Below is an extract she provided for the RYCV Magazine

Wednesday twilights: Nunyarra, Tandeka and Drambuie have raised the profile of the Bluebird class in Division C of the twilight races. Nunyarra skippered by David Barnett with crew Peter Behrendt and Ann Goodwin, won series B Divison C (10/11) on handicap. The following summer (season 2011/12) Tandeka - Peter Roberts and Gary Prestedge, performed well to win series B and achieved 2nd place in Division C for both Series A and B. Nunyarra came 4th. Three other Bluebirds competed as casual entries during the season. They were Secret, Panacea, and Paramour.

Audi Victoria Week: The passage race to Geelong on a Bluebird can be long day on the water if the breeze is hard to find. Six Bluebirds completed the race in January 2011 when dinner at the Indian restaurant was delayed by an hour. Secret was the winner in the Bluebird series over four races. No Bluebirds went to Geelong in 2012.

Bluebird Class Races

Bluebird Cup: Over the winter months yachts compete for the Bluebird Cup. In 2010, the inaugural Class Monkeys series was held on the alternate week to the Brass Monkeys races. This series was imitated by Peter Roberts with assistance from RYCV race management and supported with enthusiasm by Bluebird and Diamond classes.

State Titles: The Bluebird state championships are held over seven races in February/ March. In 2011 racing was close right up to the last race where Panacea – raced by Nick Findlay beat Drambuie sailed by Craig Black to win the state title. This year, Tandeka, Nunyarra, and Panacea competed strongly against Drambuie. However Craig on Drambuie single-handedly attained an unassailable lead after five races to become State Bluebird champion for 2012 with Tandeka in second place.

Polly Woodside Trophy: A long course series is conducted in conjunction with other events the Bluebirds compete in. One long distance race (12nm) from each of the main events is allocated to the Polly Woodside Trophy. Four races have been available from the Bluebird winter series Class Monkeys, Lipton Regatta long race and the Bluebird summer series State championships and the Geelong passage race. The format for PWT is under review to consider an alternative long distance race to the Geelong passage race. A handicap format has been introduced to encourage entries. The best three results from four races are used to award trophy points.

Crystal Ball gazing for season 2012- 2013 ...

Another two Bluebird yachts, Moody Blue and Shadow are due to "nest" at the club. As more Bluebirds attain an AMS handicap rating, look for them in mixed fleet racing eg. in the non-spinnaker division of the Brass Monkeys next winter. 

Divisions

Racing will be conducted in seven Divisions in three different course areas.

Division A, B, C and D IRC/AMS and PHD racing windward/leeward on Saturday and a long distance race on Sunday.

Trailable Yacht and Sportsboat Division CBH/SMS racing windward/leeward on Saturday and a long distance race on Sunday. A valid SMS rating certificate is required for entry in the Sportsboat Division.

Cruising with Spinnaker Division AMS/PHD racing around fixed mark courses on Saturday afternoon and Sunday scored as standalone races and as a series.

Cruising Non-Spinnaker Division AMS/PHD racing around fixed mark courses on Saturday afternoon and Sunday scored as standalone races and as a series.

OTB Williamstown Sailing Club will be conducting the races for this division . Courses will be laid in Hobsons Bay.

Yachts that do not hold either an IRC, AMS or SMS certificate may be entered in Division B, C or D at the Race Director's discretion.

Schedule of Races and Course Locations

The Regatta combines windward/leeward and passage course racing on Saturday November 17th followed by a longer distance race on Sunday November 18th.

Short Races – **Saturday 17th November** Warning Signal 1025hrs

For Divisions A, B, C, D Trailable Yachts and Sportsboats, three short course races will be conducted on Saturday, each with a target duration of 75 minutes and a minimal interval between races:—

- Division A and B will compete around laid marks in the open waters of Port Phillip, west of the main shipping channel.
- Division C and Sportsboats will compete around laid marks in the open waters of Port Phillip, east of the main shipping channel.
- Division D and Trailable Yachts will race around laid marks in Hobsons Bay.

Cruising Divisions – **Saturday 17th November** Warning Signal 1325hrs

Cruising with Spinnaker will compete over a fixed marks course with target race duration of two hours. The race will start and finish south of St Kilda in the vicinity of R3. Cruising Non-Spinnaker will compete over a fixed marks course with target race duration of two hours. The race will start and finish south of St Kilda in the vicinity of R3.

Long Race – Sunday 18th November Warning Signal 0955hrs

❖ For all divisions the longer distance race will start and finish south of St Kilda in the vicinity of R3 with separate starts for each division. The course will be around fixed marks with a range of course options to provide target race duration of between 4 and 4.5 hours for all divisions.

The Sunday race is designed to facilitate a presentation at 1600hrs on the lawn of RYCV.
