THE TANDEKA REVIVAL

Due to slight altercation with Chelinda, a swanston 36, during a Brass Monkey and a Bluebird Cup race some 3 years ago a rather large hole appeared in the forward portside of Tandeka. The mast was subsequently reconfigured during the entanglement to a Mirror style two piece arrangement that would also require some attention.

After much soul searching and deliberation (much Frothies required) it was decided to remove the keel and put the boat into the factory of Peter's and repaint it. Code for a complete strip down and re-glass and rebuild the cockpit.

The finished product is seen with a fully sheathed hull and deck and new cockpit layout.

Most boats are seen as a marriage. So to embrace this theory, you need something old (the hull) something borrowed (the mast) and something blue (colour of the hull) all the elements to stand up to the test of time.

I'm sure Peter will have many a happy day on the water with his revitalized charge now back in its element. Regards
